Minimum Immunization Requirements for School Entry (Preschool & K-12)

Immunization Requirement by Age	Doses of Vaccines Required
Children born on or before September 1, 1999 must have a minimum of:	(4) Diphtheria, Tetanus, Pertussis (DTaP) (1) Measles, Mumps, and Rubella (MMR) (3) Polio (3) Hepatitis B
Children born after September 1, 1999 through September 1, 2005 must have a minimum of:	(5) Diphtheria, Tetanus, Pertussis (DTaP) ¹ (2) Measles, Mumps, and Rubella (MMR) (3) Polio (3) Hepatitis B
Children born after September 1, 2005 ² must have a minimum of:	(5) Diphtheria, Tetanus, Pertussis (DTaP) ¹ (2) Measles, Mumps, and Rubella (MMR) (4) Polio ³ (3) Hepatitis B (2) Varicella (Chickenpox) ⁴ (2) Hepatitis A
Immunization Requirement by Grade	Doses of Vaccines Required
Children admitted to 7 th grade during or after the 2011-2012 school year must meet the following minimum immunization requirements in addition to school entry requirements:	(1) Tetanus, Diphtheria, Pertussis (Tdap) (1) Meningococcal
<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Preschool children need only be age-appropriately immunized with the required vaccines. 2. DTaP: The 5th dose is not necessary if the 4th dose was administered at age 4 years or older. 3. Polio: The 4th dose is not necessary if the 3rd dose was administered at age 4 years or older <u>and</u> at least 6 months after previous dose. 4. Varicella: History of varicella (chickenpox) disease documented by a physician or licensed health care professional meets the requirement.
