## Local Scholarships for Graduating Seniors

Genesee School is fortunate to have an extremely generous local scholarship program which awards scholarships to many of our graduating seniors every year. **The application materials for these scholarships will be made available to the seniors in late February.** None of the local scholarship applications are very extensive and seniors will have seven-eight weeks to complete their application forms and supporting documents. When the time comes I will meet with all of the seniors to explain the application procedures to them and I will also make announcements in the school newsletter that the application materials are available.

So students interested in these scholarships do not need to worry about applying for local scholarships at this time. If you want to dedicate time preparing for those applications now I would recommend working on compiling a list of your High School Activities. Your list should include sports, clubs and community service you have participated in and how many years of high school you did each of them, leadership positions you have held in any of those activities and any awards or recognition you have earned in those activities.

Otherwise, college-bound seniors would be well-advised to make sure they are completing their college admission forms and applying for other regional or national scholarships.
