# Bulldog Points of Pride 2021/22

## Did you know?

- 100% of our teachers are highly qualified. 20% are nationally board certified. 65% of the staff holds Masters degrees or higher. Genesee Schools has a 96.2% retention rate of our teaching staff.
- Genesee currently offers Govt., English, Math, Economics, Psychology and History for dual credit.
- Dual credit – 38 students have taken 281 dual credit courses.
- Four Year Graduation Rate –Genesee: 96.7%. The State of Idaho was 82.1%
- 92% of our students (Grades 7-12) are involved in some type of extra-curricular activity.
- 76% of our MS/ HS students are involved in some form of Athletic participation.
- 62% of our MS/HS students participate in IDFY (Idaho Drug Free Youth).
- 57% of our students participate in FFA; 24% of our HS students participate in Business Professionals of America (BPA); 53% of our MS/HS students participate in Band, and 10% in Choir.
- First semester pass rate was 95%. 129/136 students in grades 7-12 passed **all of** their classes.

# Supplemental Levy Election—May 17, 2022 (FY23)

The Genesee Joint School District #282 will be asking voters on May 17, 2022 to vote on the proposed one-year levy of **\$1,185,000**. This supplemental levy allows the district to maintain the quality educational programs and opportunities for students of the Genesee Joint School District #282.

The estimated average annual cost to the taxpayer on the proposed levy is a tax of **\$534.00 per \$100,000 of taxable assessed value (\$5.34 per 1,000)**, per year, based on current conditions. Currently, the District collects a supplemental levy authorized in the amount of \$985,000 which will expire when the proposed levy (\$1,185,000) goes into effect on July 1, 2022.

The determination of the levy amount is based on the discrepancy between the revenue the district receives from state and federal funding and the educational needs as determined by the Board of Trustees. Considering the property tax reduction provided by the agricultural equipment replacement exemption and the personal business property tax exemption, the **estimated cost of the levy will be approximately \$1,113,881.00**.

**Levy Informational meetings will be held in person on April 27 and May 16 at 6:00 p.m.** Meetings will be held in school cafeteria (MPR). **A Zoom meeting will be held on May 10<sup>th</sup> at 6:00 p.m.** Link will be provided on the district website.

### Four Year Plan Workshop: 8<sup>th</sup> Graders & Parents – May 24<sup>th</sup> @ 7:00pm

The State Department of Education's Idaho Administrative Code for Public Schools requires that all students have a Four Year Plan developed and placed in their school file by the end of the eighth grade year. This plan is to be the cooperative effort of the student and their parents, with the assistance of school personnel. The primary objective of this plan is to develop an initial plan of academic course choices for the four years of high school. Another desired outcome of this plan is to help the students to perceive the connection between their high school course choices and the impact those will have on their educational and/or career options after high school.

**Mr. Scripter will be conducting a Four Year Plan Workshop for eighth graders and their parents here at the school on Tuesday, May 24<sup>th</sup>. The workshop will run from 7:00-8:00p.m. and will be held in the multi-purpose room. Again, all students are required to have a four year academic plan for high school by the end of the eighth grade year, so please make every effort to attend this event.**
